

#### **University of South Australia**

Established in 1991, the University of South Australia was formed through the union of previous institutions, schools and colleges that educated the State's first teachers, artists and town planners dating back to the 1800s. It was the first Australian university to articulate graduate qualities in curriculum and the first to make a public commitment to reconciliation with our First Nations people.



We embed transformative learning into everything we do. This means that our programs will not only better prepare you for university studies but also empower you to develop the skills, mindset and resilience to succeed in study, work and life. We have 7 graduate success skills that you will build throughout your studies with us. These skills are essential for success at university and in your future career.

### How you will develop these 7 skills

Throughout our program, you will build these essential skills not just from the theory you learn in class but through practical assessments, interactive workshops and real-life activities. In every trimester, we will run an Experience Week and Employability Week where you will put your knowledge into practice and demonstrate your skills in real-world tasks.

### **Experience Week**

In our Experience Week, you will connect with other students, teachers, the university and the local community through a diverse range of activities aligned with what you're learning in class. These activities can include:

- > **The Amazing Race** team up with your classmates to solve a series of challenges in a race to the finish line.
- Exciting excursions travel to places such as the beach, wetlands or a reptile park to explore local wildlife and ecosystems.



### **University-managed student** accommodation

Enjoy exclusive student living with the support of onsite staff available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Adelaide University Village is located in the heart of the city and offers both single and shared apartment options—ideal for students seeking a supportive and secure environment.

### **Purpose-built student accommodation**

Purpose-built for student life, these options offer a vibrant, community-style living experience with the convenience of onsite facilities. Our preferred providers are Scape Adelaide University and Yugo Adelaide City, both offering high-quality accommodation designed to support your academic and social needs.

### Homestay

Living with a local host family is a great way to immerse yourself in Australian culture and practise your English outside of the classroom. Homestay provides additional support as you adjust to life in Australia. All placements are managed through the Australian Homestay Network (AHN).

### **Private Rentals**

If you prefer greater independence and flexibility, private rental accommodation allows you to choose a living arrangement that best suits your lifestyle. This option is ideal for students who want more control over their living environment.

### Are you under the age of 18?

Our College staff take particular care of students under the age of 18. You may choose to reside with a parent or eligible relative approved by the Department of

Home Affairs; OR choose to have your accommodation and welfare arranged by the College. If you require the College to arrange your accommodation and welfare, we will guide you through the following process:

1. To enter a welfare monitoring agreement with our approved welfare provider, International Student Advocates (ISA).

You will have a student advocate (local caregiver) appointed to support and oversee your welfare. You will meet with your student advocate regularly either in person, online or via the phone to check that you are managing well in your new environment.

- 3. Once you have confirmed your flight arrival details to Adelaide, you may arrange an airport pickup service with our approved provider, Hughes - Australia's Chauffeur Service.

# Foundation Studies Program

Our Foundation Studies Program provides you with a pathway to studying business, IT, engineering, medicine, nursing and much more. Upon successful completion of the Foundation Studies Program, you will have guaranteed entry to Adelaide University.



## Our Foundation Studies Program is specifically designed for international students if you:

- > Have completed the equivalent of Australian Year 11.
- > Missed out on direct entry to an undergraduate degree at Adelaide University.
- > Want to study at Adelaide University.

### Why study this program

- > For students studying at the College, once you achieve your required progression score, you are guaranteed entry to your packaged degree, and, for most bachelor's degrees, you won't need to provide any further English language evidence.
- > We will ensure that you understand all the additional entry requirements for Medicine, Dentistry, Midwifery, Nursing, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy.
- > The Foundation Studies Program is streamed, allowing you to choose elective courses that align with your chosen bachelor's degree.
- You will be issued with a packaged Confirmation of Enrolment for the entire duration of study at the College and the University.
- In addition to weekly class attendance, students are also expected to complete 20-25 hours per week of independent learning.



### Applications through agents and representatives

Eligible agents and representatives will be redirected to the Agent Portal of our Application System to submit your application.

All of our registered agents and representatives will be registered as users of the Agent Portal. Agents can start, save and submit applications in the Agent Portal. A full list of registered agents is available on our website kaplancollegeadelaide.edu.au/find-an-agent.

#### **Document certification**

As part of your application to Kaplan International College Adelaide, you MUST submit either original documents OR certified copies of your academic transcripts, qualifications and official English translations. Certification is an essential step to ensure the authenticity of your documents and avoid delays in assessment.

Every page of the document must contain all of the following elements:

- > An original stamp bearing the name of the person or organisation who verifies the document
- > A written statement in English to the effect of "I certify that this is a true copy of the original."
- > An original signature
- > The date of certification

Agents who are representing the College have the authority to sight original documents and provide certified, electronic copies when submitting the application. Agent certification must comply with the certification requirements listed above.

The following people can also certify documents:

- > A registered Kaplan education agent (acting on your behalf)
- An authorised Kaplan or College staff member
- > A Justice of the Peace, Notary Public or Consular Official
- > A Commissioner for Declarations or Affidavits
- > The registrar of the institution that issued the original document
- > A police officer or an authorised examining authority

### Applicants under the age of 18

If you will be under 18 years of age when your course starts, you must meet student visa requirements set by the Department of Home Affairs.

You must either:

- > Reside with a parent or eligible relative approved by the Department OR
- > Enter a Kaplan Guardianship Arrangement, which includes accommodation, welfare and support services.

# Receiving your offer

We will send an email to you (or your agent) with an Offer of Admission if you are successful.

#### Offer of Admission

The information in your Offer of Admission and acceptance is important, please read it carefully.

Please note the following information for your packaged offer:

- > Program names
- > Duration of programs
- > Commencement dates
- > Tuition fees
- > Acceptance and payment deadlines
- > Terms and conditions

If you have a conditional offer, the conditions are clearly outlined in your Offer of Admission. Conditions may include providing proof of English Language Proficiency, completion of academic qualifications, or provision of official documents (e.g. original or certified copies of your documents).

It is important that you provide evidence of meeting these conditions as soon as possible, to avoid delays in progressing your enrolment with the College and corresponding visa application with the Department of Home Affairs.



### Accepting your offer

Follow the acceptance process outlined below. By correctly completing the required forms, you will ensure that the processing of your acceptance and the issuing of your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) will be smooth and efficient.

### Step 1 - Offer of Admission

Log in to the Applicant Portal to accept your Offer of Admission. Make sure your personal details, especially your name, date of birth, and passport number, match exactly with the information in your passport. You will need to upload a scanned copy of both the personal ID page and signature page of your passport.

If you are working with an education agent, they may assist you in reviewing and completing this step to ensure everything is submitted correctly.

If you have a conditional offer, the conditions outlined in your Offer of Admission must be fully met prior to acceptance (if any).

### Step 2 - Fees

Payment can be made in the Applicant Portal of the Application System via the College's preferred online payment provider, Flywire.

Flywire is a secure international payment platform method that supports multiple currencies and ensures faster processing

#### Step 3 - Visas

After accepting your offer and paying your tuition fees, you can begin preparing your student visa application. You may contact your nearest Australian Embassy or Consulate, or visit the Department of Home Affairs website to understand current visa requirements, documentation and processing times to be prepared ahead of time.

#### Step 5 – Apply for visa

After receiving your CoE, you can now lodge your student visa application through ImmiAccount, the official online portal managed by the Department of Home Affairs.

If applying via an agent, they will assist you with this process.


